Theme: Christ is the focus and fulfillment of the entire Old Testament, and we should expect to see Him in its pages and to find its fulfillment in Him.

- B. We are Christ centered because Scripture is
- C. Not just the NT the OT as well!
- D. This teaching will show that NT teaches this fact
- E. Series will look at Christ as OT focus & fulfillment

II. John 5:39 – Jesus and the OT

- A. The Pharisees diligently studied the Scripture!
 - 1. Jesus does not deny they studied Scripture
 - 2. Example of phylacteries, etc.
- B. They did so because they thought this brought life
 - 1. Quote by Hillel; Baruch 4:1; Deut 32:46-47
 - 2. Only brings life if it leads to God (Dt 30:19-20)
- C. The Scripture testifies about Jesus!
 - 1. He is the focus of the book they had studied!
 - 2. Yet they completely missed Him!

- 3. He is the fulfillment of OT
- 4. Yet they did not recognize Him

III. Jesus is the Focus & Fulfillment of OT

- A. Consistent teaching in NT
 - 1. Not just made 1 or 2 places all over
 - 2. Not just parts of OT everything!
 - 3. Not by just 1 or 2 people many people
- B. Some examples
 - 1. Focus Jn 5:39; Lk 24:25-27; Gal 3:16; 2 Tim 3:15
 - 2. Fulfillment Mt 5:17; Acts 13:32-35; Lk 1:67-75; 2 Cor 1:20
 - 3. Many topics & themes
 - a. Suffer Lk 24:25-26; 45-48; Acts 17:1-3
 - b. Death 1 Cor 15:3-4
 - c. Raised–Lk 24:45-48; Acts 17:1-3; 13:32-35; 1 Cor 15:3-4
 - d. Law Mt 5:17
 - e. Promises Galatians 3:16; 2 Corinthians 1:20
 - 4. All parts of OT Luke 24:25-27, 44
- C. To miss Jesus is to **completely** miss OT
 - 1. Like watching Super Bowl and not noticing game

2. If you miss Jesus, you missed it all!
